- There is a garage.
- There are big windows.
- There isn't a fence.
- There aren't any pets.
- Is there a big lawn?

Yes, there is.

- Are there windows in the first floor?

Yes, there are.



Verb there to be

	Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
Singular	there is ...	there isn't ...	Is there ...?
Plural	there are ...	there aren't ...	Are there?
